ERAF Equine Manager

The Equine Manager is responsible for the day-to-day care of approximately 25-35 horses. These responsibilities will include stable management, employee supervision, and equine related grounds management.

We are looking for a very reliable, organized, self-motivated individual with extensive horse experience and 3-5 years of barn management or related experience. Must be confident handling and caring for abused, traumatized and feral horses.

The ideal candidate must be a team player and adept at maintaining efficient systems to run stable and grounds care routines; have strong, timely, and tech savvy communication skills; and be capable of handling the physical demands of the position.

Must have experience creating nutritionally sound feeding programs, providing first level medical care including recognizing symptoms of illness and lameness, administering oral medications, wound care, and bandaging.

- Train or work with trainer to create training programs to prepare horses for adoption
- Track animal training, care, and overall health updates using ERAF processes and software
- Help train and work with volunteers
- Order and maintain barn supplies
- Arrange and supervise animal specialty care providers (vet, farrier etc)
- Work with the Facilities Team as needed to maintain the care and upkeep of barn equipment/ facilities and pastures
- Assists with events and activities as needed
- Work with the Adoption Committee and trainer to help match potential adopters with horses
- Contribute to and work within budgets

- Strong knowledge of equine first aid
- Strong interpersonal skills to collaborate with trainers, volunteers, staff, and adopters
- Proficient in stall upkeep and delegation of barn chores
